First LANSA research paper on Afghanistan published!

Research Paper on reducing anaemia prevalence in Afghanistan aims to examine the socio-economic correlates of anaemia in women, and potential sources of iron in household diets.

Analysis lends support to the notion that linkage between sheep ownership and anemia risk is partly due to consumption arising from ownproduction in the presence of market incompleteness.

LANSA's first paperless survey in South Asia

For <u>Women's Work and Nutrition</u> study in <u>Pakistan</u>, baseline survey was done using a web-based (tablet



data entry, reduces survey-analysis time lag, and minimises data entry errors. Over 1000 mother-child pairs were surveyed.



LANSA has its first stakeholder event in Kabul, Afghanistan

Collaborating with AREU (Afghanistan Research and Evaluation Unit),
LANSA facilitated a knowledge-sharing multi-sectoral stakeholder event in Kabul, Afghanistan on April 25. The half-day dialogue saw Afghan research work presented to key agri-nutrition stakeholders coming from Kabul and four other provinces. Media was also present.



Two LANSA working papers on India are now online

'Child underweight, land productivity and public services: a district-level analysis for India' and 'Learning From the Past: Framing of Undernutrition in India Since Independence and Its Links to Agriculture' are published. Policy implications are that state governments should strive to achieve administrative convergence of agricultural development and public provisioning.




