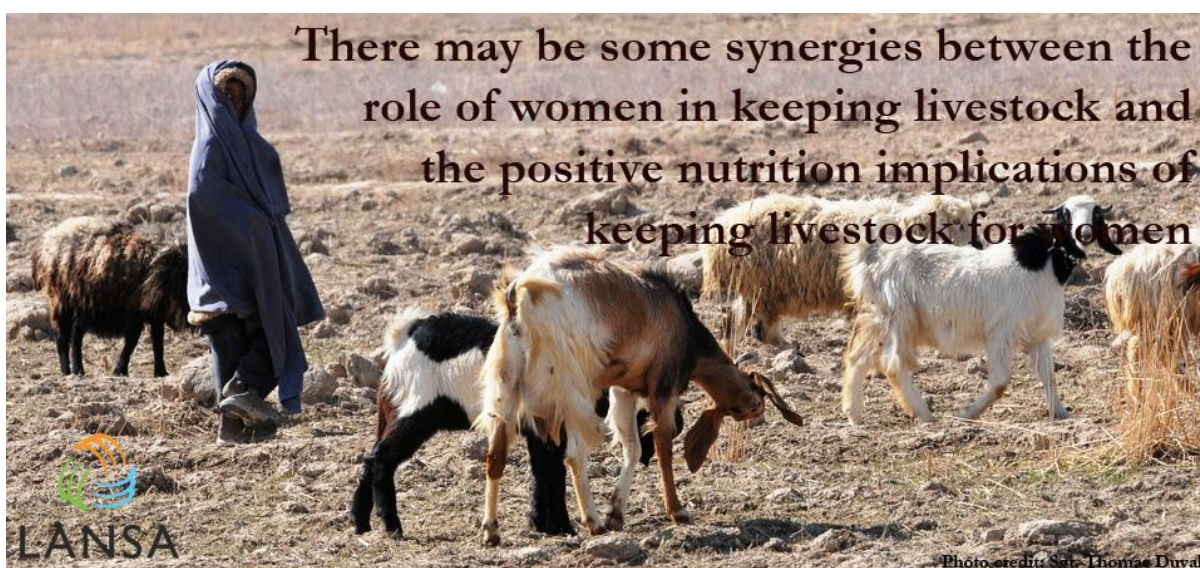

Sheep ownership and red meat consumption from small stock holdings may play a role to lower anaemia prevalence amongst women



Women generally are more involved in live-stock-related activities, while men are more involved in crop-related activities and control income and resources.



There may be some synergies between the role of women in keeping livestock and the positive nutrition implications of keeping livestock for women

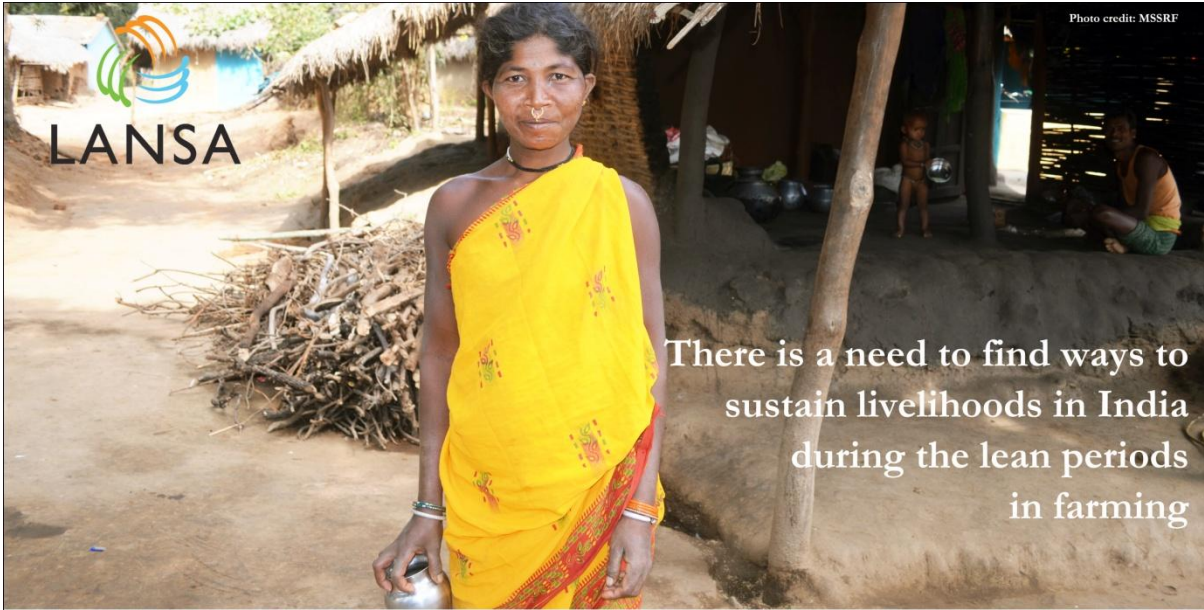

Pakistani women employed in agriculture are more likely to have malnourished children

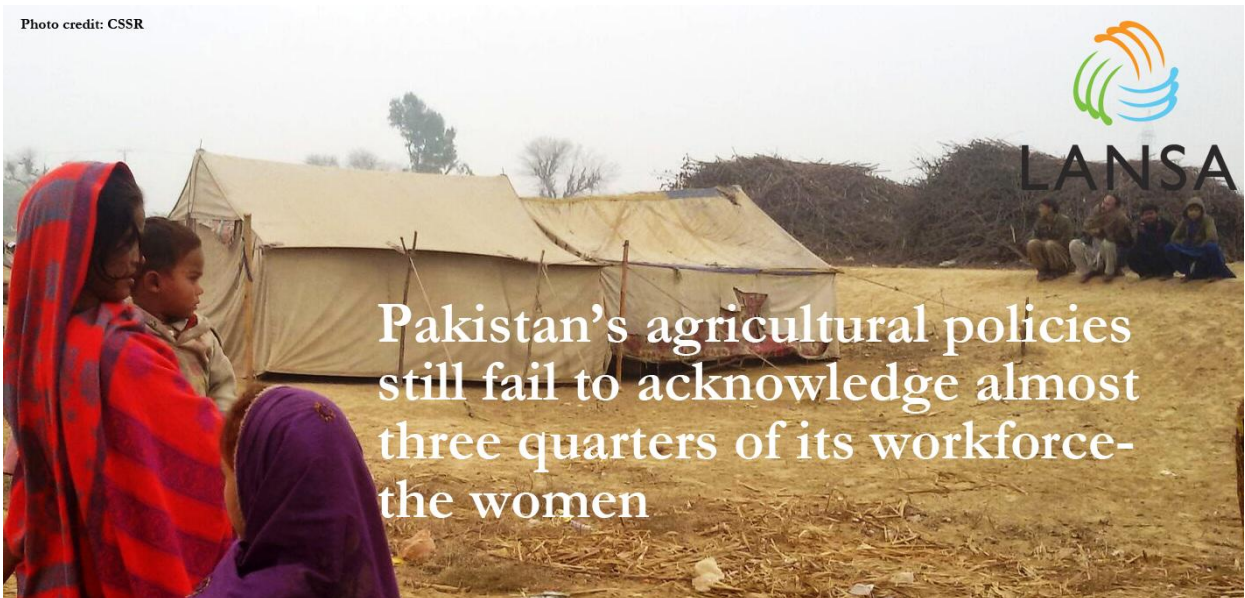
